 - Dependent on Timing
 - 20% of 85-90 Undervalued
 - 15-20 Stocks on My Radar Screen

My Investing Philosophy

- Stock Price Double in 12 Months or Less
- Sell ½ of Position
- Cost Basis = Zero for ½ of Position
- Playing with Someone Else's Money
- Reinvest Money in Another Undervalued Stock
- Open Orders to Sell ½ at Double
- Program Selling at Intervals on Uptick
